Welcome to the 2024 school year

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Welcome to the 2024 school year and a warm welcome to returning and new students and families. In 2024 we are setting high expectations for every student.

From Transition to Year 6 all students are participating in 2 hours a day of Structured Literacy based on the research-based Science of Reading. Here is a ten-minute clip that briefly explains the research and theory Can we Afford to Ignore the Science of Reading? | Melissa Hostetter | TEDxUofISpringfield (youtube.com)-.

Our school goal is to improve achievement in Reading. Teachers will be tracking student achievement in Reading and parents are encouraged to check in with class teachers on their child's progress. Teachers will send home Progress Reports at the end of this term as well as holding parent teacher interviews. If you want to know more about your child's learning or wellbeing, contact your child's teacher.

If you would like to support your child at home with Reading, Students (Year 1 - 6) get free access to Reading Eggs as part of the curriculum pack for 2024. There is also a handy free eBook suitable for parents of students in Years T-2 at Parents - Decodable Readers Australia and the school has the full subscription for Decodables Australia. All teachers can share with families access to Decodable Australia's online library.

From sleep and behaviour to anxiety and screen time, they cover a range of important parenting topics.

Safety before and after school and access during school hours

For safety reasons children are not to play in the assembly area, on play equipment and around the buildings out of school hours. The **school is unsupervised before 7:50am and after 2:40pm** on school days and so children are asked not to play on school grounds outside of these times. We expect that families who need to leave their child at school before 750am will access the Outside School Hours program. At the end of a school day, students waiting for parent or sibling pickups should do so at either of the **main gates** to the school. After school, students are expected to walk/ride directly home or wait in the designated waiting areas at the front or rear entrances of the school. Students waiting for brothers/ sisters from Palmerston College or catching the bus are expected to wait at the front gate next to Reception.

Please note that for safety reasons, all gates are locked during the school day and between 8:30 and 2:00pm access is only through the front gate next to Reception. Students arriving late to school (after 815am) or students who need to leave during the school day need to do so through Reception.

Meet the teacher and family BBQ

Our first school community event will be the Meet the Teacher and Family BBQ which will be held on Wednesday 15 February between 4:00pm and 5:30pm. It is a chance to be shown around the classroom and school by your child- and meet your child's teacher for 2024. This first open classroom event gives parents a chance to have informal conversations with their child's new teacher and have a look at how their child has started the school year. We will also have our usual sausage sizzle. Remember if you would like a lengthier chat with your child's teacher you can make an appointment at any time by contacting your child's teacher.






MOBILE PHONES AND SMART WATCHES

NAPLAN

National Assessment Program - Literacy and Numeracy Information for parents and carers

- All students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 in Australia do NAPLAN tests in March each year.
- NAPLAN tests students' skills in reading, writing and maths.
- The test questions are presented in Standard Australian English dialect.
- Students read some of the questions and listen to others with headphones.
- The tests will get easier or harder, depending on how students are going in the test.
- Students do four different tests. The names of the four tests are:









Writing

Reading

Conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation)

Numeracy
